Important News & Notes:

Welcome! We would like to welcome Miss Kasey Mannion to Monsignor Slade. Miss Mannion will be taking over for Mrs. Gilroy as the fourth grade ELA and social studies teacher. Miss Mannion will start on Monday, October 19. Mrs. Gilroy will co-teach with Miss Mannion through October 23 so that there is a smooth transition. Please give Miss Mannion a hearty welcome as she joins our community!

Changes to the Daily Wellness Survey: Soon, there will be a fourth required question added to the daily wellness survey that you complete prior to arriving at school. A “Yes” response to the question will exclude the student or staff member from being allowed entry into the school building. Below is how the new question will read:

Since completing your or your child’s most recent wellness screening, are you, or if answering for your child, your child waiting for a COVID-19 test result, been diagnosed with COVID-19, or been instructed by any health care provider or the health department to isolate or quarantine?

Halloween at Slade: Halloween will be celebrated on October 30, 2020, but it will look a little different at Slade this year. Students in grades Pre-K-5 may wear costumes to school. Those costumes must be of simple design, no large or blow-up costumes are permitted. No Halloween masks may be worn, and no additional items that are carried as part of the costume may be brought to school. Students in grades 6-8 will be wearing black, orange and white. Students should follow all out-of-uniform guidelines found in the Parent & Student Handbook on pg. 46. All students are still required to wear cloth masks of at least two layers that day; however, they may be of another color or appropriate design. Unfortunately, we are not permitted to hold a parade this year. Please do not send in any food, drink, or treat items not requested by a teacher.

Mode-of-Learning Commitment - REVISED: We will be sending out a new intent form to parents early next week as we have learned that many remote learners are considering returning for in-person instruction for T2. A large influx of students, especially at the middle school level, could result in the need for a hybrid schedule; therefore, we may need additional time to develop a revised schedule. We ask that all families complete the intent form no later than October 23, 2020, whether or not your mode of learning is changing, so that we may adequately prepare classrooms to accommodate social distancing.

Uniform reminders: Beginning November 2, 2020, students will be required to wear their winter uniforms. Please consult pages 44-47 of the Parent & Student Handbook regarding the dress and PE uniforms requirements. Until then, students are welcomed to wear either their summer or winter uniform. Currently boys do not need to wear ties and/or belts. Please be reminded that the PE sweatshirt and hoodie cannot take the place of the sweater or vest.

If families are in need of winter uniform items, please reach out to Mrs. Debbie Van Bergen, at deborah.vanbergen@gmail.com, as we are unable to hold a used uniform exchange at this time. Please submit all requests by October 23, 2020. Any available requests will be prepared for pick-up and/or sent home with students on October 27/28, 2020. Requests will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Please be aware that there is little to no available stock of the winter P.E. uniform clothing. As the fall days become cooler and we look toward winter, please ensure that your student is prepared with needed outdoor wear to warm them in the mornings, at recess and lunch, and at dismissal. There will be times when teachers are taking students outside for class, so each student will need to be prepared for cooler days. Additionally, please remember that on rainy/snowy days it is important that children have jackets or raincoats with hoods.

Happy Helpers for the Homeless: For those of you who may not know, Monsignor Slade Catholic School has been supporting Happy Helpers for the Homeless since the late 90s. This organization was founded by an 8-year-old girl from Glen Burnie named Amber Coffman, who was volunteering with her mother at a local homeless shelter. She saw the tremendous needs of this vulnerable population and tried to figure out a way to help. She began simply by making lunches in her home to distribute to the homeless people living in the streets. Other people heard her story and volunteered to prepare and donate lunches to support her mission. In fact, our middle school students first began preparing lunches for the homeless as part of a religion project to support Amber in her efforts. Slade has been donating homemade lunches to the organization ever since.

Unfortunately, at this time, Happy Helpers cannot accept homemade lunches; however, we have learned of alternate means of supporting this worthy organization: "Bag a Breakfast" and canned food donations. Students and families can prepare a breakfast-to-go, including items such as small boxes of cereal or packets of oatmeal, granola bars, juice boxes and more. Currently, Happy Helpers is in desperate need of canned foods, especially items such as soup, stews, beans, etc. Since we cannot allow collection of canned goods within the school building at this time, we have decided to collect these items once a month on the same day as our "Bag a Breakfast" donations are collected. The first donation event will include 5th and 6th grades on Friday, November 6th, but anyone will be welcomed to donate canned goods. We will include further details on the items to include in the "Bag a Breakfast" in the coming weeks, but wanted to make you aware of this exciting new chapter of our community service with Happy Helpers for the Homeless.

Thank you, Parents! We would like to thank Mr. Matt Dzambo, who volunteers to cover our morning arrival by helping students safely navigate the parking lot every Monday through Wednesday. Additionally, we would like to thank the Driver family for their generous donation of gift cards to each of our teachers and staff members. Lastly, we would like to thank Stephanie Baker, Rosa Cruz-Penafiel, Michelle Edwards, Patricia Reno, Nick Rinnius, and Sharon Scriba for volunteering to help provide lunch and recess coverage during the day. Important News & Notes (continued):

Forgotten Masks: Students have been doing a great job of remembering to wear their masks to school. On the few occasions when they have forgotten, the School is able to provide masks. The first time a student forgets, he/she is given a white mask for the day. For any additional time after that, the School will issue a green Slade mask and charge the \$5 cost on the family's FACTS account. Please note: Slade masks are still available for purchase for \$5 each through the school store. Orders are filled on a first-come, first-served basis.



Returning from Quarantine: When students are returning to school with all books and materials following a quarantine period, parents may pull into the teachers' parking lot to unload all student items. If the items are too numerous or too heavy for students to carry, students can leave excess items inside the door and a staff member will carry them to class for the student.

Scholarship Program

The Maryland State Council of the Knights of Columbus in partnership with the Knights of Columbus Insurance Advisors is the sponsor of several High School Scholarships for its members and for Catholic students in general. Below is a summary of these scholarships and information regarding eligibility for scholarship awards.

The Frederick M. Gossman Memorial High School Scholarship

Designed to assist those Brother Knights, in good standing and holding membership in councils within the jurisdiction of Maryland in paying tuition for their sons and daughters at accredited Catholic High Schools; three grants of \$1,500.00 per year, for up to four years, will be awarded. Awards will be made based on academic excellence, personal qualifications, and financial need. The children of deceased members are also eligible, provided the member was in good standing at the time of death.

The William J. O'Brien Jr., Memorial Catholic High School Scholarship

Three grants of \$1,500.00 per year for up to four years will be awarded. This program is open to any **Catholic student** who is a resident of the State of Maryland, including children and grandchildren of any member, in good standing, of a Knights of Columbus council within the jurisdiction of Maryland. Applicants must have been officially accepted at or must be students at accredited Catholic High Schools. Applications will be judged on academic excellence, personal qualifications, and financial need.

Application period is from October 1, 2020 to February 1, 2021. All applications must be received by the Scholarship Committee no later than February 1, 2021.

1 Of the following:
Cough
Shortness of breath
Difficulty Breathing
New loss of taste or smell

OR

2 Of the following:
Fever of 100.4F or higher
Chills
Muscle aches
Sore Throat
Headache
Nausea or Vomiting
Diarrhea
Fatigue
Congestion or runny nose

Stay home if symptoms begin before school, or go to the school nurse if symptoms start during the school day.

When can I return to school?

Positive COVID-19 PCR Test

May return 10 days after symptoms first appeared

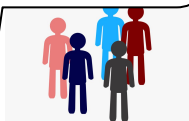
AND

At least 24 hours no fever without taking medication

AND

Symptoms have improved.

Close contacts should stay home for 14 days from date of last exposure to confirmed or suspected (no alternative diagnosis) case.



No COVID-19 PCR Test Done

May return 10 days after symptoms first appeared

AND

At least 24 hours no fever without taking medication

AND

Symptoms have improved.

OR

Doctor's note with a written alternative diagnosis and symptoms have improved/no fever for 24 hours without medication.

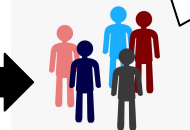
Negative COVID-19 PCR Test

At least 24 hours no fever without taking medicine

AND

Respiratory symptoms have improved.

Close contacts *do not* need to stay home as long as they remain asymptomatic.

- Test run!
 - Check audio & sound. Is the speaker loud enough? Any competing sounds?
 - Is the picture still and clear? (Remember to clean your lens!)
- Record final version
