# Important News & Notes:

**Winter Uniform:** Please be reminded that students need to begin wearing winter uniforms on Monday, November 2, 2020. Please see pp. 44-46 of the Parent & Student Handbook for guidelines.

**Happy Helpers for the Homeless:** Just a reminder that 5th & 6th graders are asked to contribute two brown bag breakfasts on Friday, November 6th. Each of the students in grades 5 & 6 will receive two brown bags on Wednesday, November 4th to use as they "bag a breakfast." Your breakfast donations should include one of each of the following:



- 1. Small box of cereal or packet of oatmeal w/cup & spoon
- 2. Pop Tart, Nutrigrain bar or granola bar
- 3. Piece of fruit, fruit cup, or box of raisins
- 4. Hot chocolate pack w/cup & spoon
- 5. Juice box
- 6. Napkin

Please note: If remote learners in grades 5 & 6 would like to participate in the "Bag a Breakfast" effort for November, you can prepare the breakfasts as directed above and drop them off at the carport on Friday morning. If you would like, you could stop by the office on Wednesday or Thursday during school hours to pick up two brown bags, or simply use your own.

There will be volunteers at the carport entrance to collect the bagged breakfasts on Friday morning. We will also collect canned foods from any/all grade levels on that morning. If your child is not in 5th or 6th grade, but you would like to contribute to the canned food drive, please have your child drop the canned goods in the collection box at the carport entrance. All breakfast bags and canned food donations should be dropped off by 8:30 a.m. We thank you so much for your generosity!

# Grade Level Reminders:

**Grade 8 - Updated:** The HSPT Registration Portal is open. Click on the link to register your students for the December 2, 2020, test which will be held here at MSCS. The cost of the test is \$40 and must be paid online when you register. Be sure to select Monsignor Slade (005) as the site where your child will test. <u>https://stsusers.com/stsusers/registration/static/baltimore.php</u>. The deadline to submit documentation to receive accommodations for students who have plans for the HSPT is Friday, November 20. After that date, the upload feature will be locked, and there is no way to upload documentation to the registration portal.

# Scholarship Program

The Maryland State Council of the Knights of Columbus in partnership with the Knights of Columbus Insurance Advisors is the sponsor of several High School Scholarships for its members and for Catholic students in general. Below is a summary of these scholarships and information regarding eligibility for scholarship awards.

## The Frederick M. Gossman Memorial High School Scholarship

Designed to assist those Brother Knights, in good standing and holding membership in councils within the jurisdiction of Maryland in paying tuition for their sons and daughters at accredited Catholic High Schools; three grants of \$1,500.00 per year, for up to four years, will be awarded. Awards will be made based on <u>academic excellence</u>, <u>personal qualifications</u>, and <u>financial need</u>. The children of deceased members are also eligible, provided the member was in good standing at the time of death.

# The William J. O'Brien Jr., Memorial Catholic High School Scholarship

Three grants of \$1,500.00 per year for up to four years will be awarded. This program is open to any <u>Catholic student</u> who is a resident of the State of Maryland, including children and grandchildren of any member, in good standing, of a Knights of Columbus council within the jurisdiction of Maryland. Applicants must have been officially accepted at or must be students at accredited Catholic High Schools. Applications will be judged on <u>academic excellence</u>, <u>personal qualifications</u>, and <u>financial need</u>.

Application period is from October 1, 2020 to February 1, 2021. All applications must be received by the Scholarship Committee no later than February 1, 2021.

# Make Trick-Or-Treating Safer



- Avoid direct contact with trick-or-treaters.
- Give out treats outdoors, if possible.
- Set up a station with individually bagged treats for kids to take.
- Wash hands before handling treats.
- Wear a mask.

Traditional Halloween activities are fun, but some can increase the risk of getting or spreading COVID-19 or influenza. Plan alternate ways to participate in Halloween.



- Make your cloth mask part of your costume.
- A costume mask is **NOT** a substitute for a cloth mask.
- Do NOT wear a costume mask over a cloth mask. It can make breathing more difficult.
- Masks should NOT be worn by children under the age of 2 or anyone who has trouble breathing.

# **Wash Your Hands**

- Bring hand sanitizer with you and use it after touching objects or other people.
- Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

6 feet apart

- Parents: supervise young children using hand sanitizer.
- Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds when you get home and before you eat any treats.

# **Keep Your Distance**

- Stay at least 6 feet away from others who do not live with you
- Indoors and outdoors, you are more likely to get or spread COVID-19 when you are in close contact with others for a long time.
