

Mrs. Majoros received her undergraduate degree in Psychology from Mount St. Mary's University and a Masters in Special Education from Johns Hopkins University, where she went on to obtain a graduate certificate in the Education of Students with Autism and Other Pervasive Developmental Disorders, as well as a Post Masters Certificate in Applied Behavior Analysis. She is a Certified Special Education Teacher, a Certified Autism Specialist, and a Board Certified Behavior Analyst. She has worked with students with special needs and their families for over 15 years. Mrs. Majoros is currently the Director of Programming for RISE for Autism and an Adjunct Faculty Member at Johns Hopkins University.




# Using Scrip Cards on the Go
