

In-Person Learners: If you have chosen in-person learning for your student(s), it is expected that your child will attend school each day. <u>covid19@msladeschool.com</u>. We have found that when in-person learners' attendance is not regular, disparities are created which make it difficult for both teachers and students to ensure consistent learning and progress.

T3 Returning Students: Today, March 5, 2021, marks the start of T3. Many students returned to in-person learning for the first time this year. We are very happy to be welcoming back more students for this final trimester of the 2020-2021 school year.

Parents should have received a wellness survey; this survey should be filled out each morning prior to arriving on campus. A large sign with the last name and grade level of the youngest child should be placed in the passenger side front window. After being directed to a drop-off lane, please have students wait in the car until a staff member signals for them to step out. Students will then follow the yellow line down to a yellow cone where they will wait until a staff member directs them to safely cross and walk to the building.

Students should enter through the following marked doors: Pre-K4-1st grade = carport door; 3rd, 7th, and 8th grade = middle stairwell door; and 2nd, 4th, 5th, and 6th grade = the far right stairwell doors.

Also, please be reminded that only plain water may be contained in water bottles; no juice, coffee, sodas, etc., are permitted.

From the School Nurse:

Active Travel Restrictions by Governor Hogan:

- On December 17, 2020:
 - The governor issued an emergency order requiring Marylanders to limit all travel to essential purposes only. All Marylanders who do travel outside of Maryland or any individuals who do travel to Maryland must either obtain a negative COVID-19 test result or selfquarantine for 10 days. This applies to all states, with the exception of Delaware, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia, and Washington, DC.
 - "This Order remains effective until after termination of the state of emergency and the proclamation of the catastrophic health emergency has been rescinded, or until rescinded, superseded, amended, or revised by additional orders."


- Please note that the school requires a COVID-19 PCR test and does not accept rapid test results.

- Please keep this Executive Order in mind as you plan your Easter break.

COVID-19 Testing Pilot Update:

- As of March 3, 2021, the Archdiocese is changing the lab that our PCR tests are processed by. Instead of the Maryland State Lab, we will be sending specimens collected at school to Mako Medical Laboratories via FedEx.
- The type of swab performed remains the same. Both the rapid and PCR tests performed at school with consent are anterior nare swabs which are inserted less than 1 inch into each nostril.
- PCR test results will now be available through a patient portal on Mako's website that you can access using your student's information.

Spring Tips:

- Please refer to the venn diagram below. COVID-19 and allergies have a lot of symptoms in common and only a physician is able to diagnose. Your child may be sent home if they have multiple symptoms.
- In order to limit this as much as possible...
 - 0 If your child has seasonal allergies and the school does not have documentation, please have your physician fax documentation to the school at 410-787-0594.
 - 0 Speak with your child's pediatrician about daily allergy medication if appropriate.



New loss of taste or smell

From the School Nurse: (continued)

- Two of the following:
 - Fever of 100.4 or higher
 - Chills
 - Muscle aches
 - Sore throat
 - \circ Headache
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea
 - Fatigue

 \Rightarrow

- Congestion or runny nose
- If your child is showing COVID-like symptoms... notify the nurse at <u>j.lydon@msladeschool.com</u> and contact your physician. You must then pick **one** of the following options and send documentation in order for your child to return to school:
 - Receive an alternative diagnosis from a physician (strep throat, ear infection, seasonal allergies, etc.)
 - Schedule your child for a COVID-19 PCR test and receive negative PCR results. We do not accept rapid results in order for your child to return to school.
 - Have your child successfully complete a 10 day quarantine and remain asymptomatic. Day 0 is the onset of symptoms.
- \Rightarrow If your child is a close contact of someone at school... you will be notified when the sick individual receives a test result or alternative diagnosis.
- ⇒ If a parent or member of the household is sick... please keep your child (who is a close contact) home from school to decrease the risk of transmission. Make sure the sick individual is isolating away from the rest of the household. Children can return to school once the sick individual receives a negative COVID-19 PCR test or an alternative diagnosis from a physician.
- \Rightarrow If anyone in the household is awaiting results from a COVID-19 test... All students must stay home while the family member is waiting for results. This also means that students who are waiting for their own test results must stay home.
- $\Rightarrow If a parent or immediate family member receives a positive test... please try to isolate yourself as much as possible and follow the Maryland Health Department Guidelines. Children must quarantine for 10 days since the last exposure to the COVID-19 positive family member before returning to school. If isolation from the sick individual is impossible, the child's quarantine period begins when the affected individual's isolation period ends.$

- Thank you to those who have been using the <u>covid19@msladeschool.com</u> email to report symptoms and keep the school updated on their children's status. Prompt notification allows us to contact trace, limit exposure, and keep the students safe.

We also anticipate that Kindergarten and 6th grades will soon transition to waitlist status. 


Mission Statement

Decision Aid: Exclusion and Return for Laboratory Confirmed COVID-19 Cases and Persons with COVID-19-like Illness in Schools, Child Care Programs, and Youth Camps

For the purposes of this decision aid, COVID-19-like illness is defined as: Any 1 of the following: cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, new loss of taste or smell, OR At least 2 of the following: fever of 100.4° or higher (measured or subjective), chills or shaking chills, muscle aches, sore throat, headache, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, and congestion or runny nose.
