Important News & Notes:

May Procession: Next Tuesday, May 4th, students will enjoy a modified May Procession and Crowning of Mary, a traditional Roman Catholic ritual held during the month of May. The queen symbol was attributed to Mary because she was a perfect follower of Christ, who is the absolute "crown" of creation. She is the Mother of the Son of God, the Mother of Christ. It is a solemn procession, and at its close a statue of the Blessed Virgin is crowned with a garland or crown of flowers honoring Mary as "the Queen of May." If possible, please have your student bring in a single flower to be included in the bouquets that are laid at Mary's feet.

Grade Level Reminders:

7th Grade Pre-HSPT Test: Parents, you should have received an email on Wednesday with details about the pre-HSPT. Please mark your calendars as all Archdiocesan elementary schools will administer the pre-HSPT to all 7th graders on Tuesday, May 4th. This is a new initiative aimed at preparing rising 8th grade students for the fall 2021 HSPT administration. All in-person and remote learners will be taking this practice test on campus beginning at 8:30 a.m. In-person learners will take it within their cohort classrooms. Remote students will be taking the test in the MPR and are asked to arrive in uniform between 8:00-8:15 a.m. in order to be temperature checked and have time to settle in prior to the start of the test. The test will last approximately three hours Remote students will be escorted out following the end of the test.

Rising 7th & 8th graders: Anne Arundel Community College is offering a Gen-Cyber fully funded by the National Security Agency and the National Science Foundation and is provided at no charge to selected applicants. Students will learn about safe online behavior, ethics and cybersecurity from experienced instructors. Topics will include application development, protecting information, password security, remote access and building your own computer with Raspberry Pi. They will participate in collaborative projects and learn how to solve problems, evaluate evidence, analyze arguments and generate hypotheses.

New Ouarantine Guidelines as of 4/28:



UPDATED – How long does a student, educator, or other staff person who has been identified as a close contact of a person with laboratory-confirmed or probable COVID-19 need to be excluded from school?

• Close contacts of a person with COVID-19 or probable COVID-19 who was in the school building should be identified by the school and the local health department for the purpose of making quarantine recommendations.

From the School Nurse (continued):

- Close contacts who are not fully vaccinated should not attend school, work in, or visit a school building until completing quarantine. A quarantine period of 14 days remains the safest option for close contacts of persons with confirmed or probable COVID-19 who are not fully vaccinated.
- Based on guidance from the CDC, the following options to shorten quarantine may be an acceptable alternative in the school setting depending upon local circumstances and resources:
 - Quarantine can end after Day 10 if NO symptoms have been reported during daily monitoring; OR
 - Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a diagnostic specimen (collected on Day 5 or later) tests negative and if NO symptoms have been reported during daily monitoring. The specimen may be collected and tested within 48 hours before the time of planned quarantine discontinuation, but quarantine cannot be discontinued earlier than after Day 7.
 - When a person meets these criteria and quarantine is ended early, all of the following must be implemented:
 - Daily symptom monitoring continues through Day 14; AND
 - Persons are counseled regarding the need to adhere strictly to all recommended mitigation strategies including correct and consistent face covering use, social distancing, and self-monitoring for symptoms of COVID- 19 through Day 14; AND
 - Persons are advised that if any symptoms develop, they should immediately self-isolate and contact their health care provider to determine if they need to be tested and how long they should be excluded from work or school.

Tick Season Tips:

Preventing Tick Bites...

- Use repellents that contain 20-30% DEET on exposed skin and clothing for several hours of protection. Always follow the product instructions—especially when it comes to the age of your child—and avoid hands, eyes, and mouth.
- Avoid contact with tall grass.

Check your children frequently for ticks, especially after they go outdoors...

- Ticks can be as small as a poppy seed.
- Check behind knees, elbows, armpits, and ears, as well as anywhere covered in hair.

How to remove a tick...

- Use tweezers to grasp the tick. Get as close to the skin's surface as possible. Pull upward with steady, even pressure. Do not worry if you are unable to remove the mouth of the tick. Once the body is removed, the tick is unable to transmit disease. Clean the bite area with soap and water or rubbing alcohol.
- Consider saving the tick in a plastic baggie in case you need to visit the doctor.

Pay attention to the bite site...

- Lyme disease is primarily carried by deer ticks. Adult deer ticks grow to about the size of a sesame seed and have reddish bodies with black markings and black legs.
- Symptoms of Lyme disease can include a bull's-eye rash, joint swelling (most common in knees), or flu-like symptoms including fever, achiness, or fatigue/lack of energy.
- Lyme symptoms can develop 3-30 days after being bitten. Contact your physician if you notice any of the previously listed symptoms.

You are invited to join our top notch summer band program which is open to current and former members. Students will receive all new great music and perform in a concert. Former band members who miss playing their instrument or being in the school band --- use this summer to be prepared to play again in the fall with your friends. Summer Band Clinic - 2021

What a year it has been! We are excited to share the details of our upcoming summer band clinic. Playing a musical instrument is a year-round activity, and as we continue our path towards in-person instruction, we have developed a plan which will enable us to continue your child's musical development over the summer. Participation is especially important for beginning students.

FORMAT: The instruction aspect of the clinic will be an online activity, but we are planning a safe, socially-distanced in-person concert at the end of summer band. If we are not able to hold an in-person concert due archdiocesan or state rules, then a virtual concert will be held. The clinic will consist of three distinct bands: beginning (those completing their first year), intermediate and advanced; your school band director will determine the level. Summer band instruction will take place over 3 weeks and our 4th week will be our dress rehearsals and the concert.

INSTRUCTION DATES: The summer clinic will begin on Tuesday, June 29 and will be held three times per week ending Thursday, July 15. **Sessions will be held Tuesday evenings from 6:00 – 9:00 pm; Wednesday afternoons from 1:00 – 4:00 pm; and Thursday mornings from 9:30 am – 12:30 pm.** Each session will be divided into three 45-minute activities: a sectional, band rehearsal, and music theory and games. A short break will be held between each activity. Students can complete all three activities in one day or they may divide them over the three days. The program can be tailored to fit individual family needs, and <u>participants may attend as often as they like --- there is no limit.</u> Note: the Tuesday sessions will be recorded for those students who need to miss that week; student names will not be recorded. Recorded sessions will be available for viewing upon request only; please contact your school band director for the link.

CONCERT AND DRESS REHEARSAL: The dress rehearsals and concert will take place <u>outside</u> during the evening hours the week of July 19. We hope to hold a dress rehearsal for each band at a local Catholic elementary school on Monday, July 19 with a rain date of July 20th. The time for each band will be posted as soon as possible. The concert will be held Wednesday, July 21st with a rain date of Thursday, July 22nd. The concert report time and start time will be posted as soon as possible. While it is highly encouraged, participation in the dress rehearsal and concert is not mandatory in order to take part in summer band. **In the event we are unable to have an in-person concert, the dress rehearsals and concert will be held virtually.**

FEE and REGISTRATION: \$112 per child. Access to this program will be available ONLY to families who are registered. There is no limit to the number of sessions your child may attend. Access codes, times for specific levels and materials will be sent to you when we receive your registration form and fee. To guarantee you receive the code, times and materials prior to the start, registration forms and fee must be received in the band office by June 15th. If you prefer to have the materials mailed to you rather than emailed, please indicate that on your registration form and include an additional fee of \$7.00 to cover the extra expense.

EQUIPMENT: To fully participate we ask that everyone have video capability and a device with a microphone, a cell phone or tablet should suffice.

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
