

Standardized Tests

Our school provides standardized testing every year for children in grades 3 through 8. I thought that some parents might like some information about this topic.

Standardized tests measure what a student knows or how well he or she learns, compared to other students of the same age and grade level across the nation. The same questions, rules and time limits are used for all students taking the test at each grade level.

Most children who take tests feel some nervousness or anxiety. Some view tests as threats. Therefore, parents need to know a few tips which will help their child feel better about taking tests, especially standardized tests. Provide opportunity for your child to talk about their feelings about tests. Have them draw pictures or write stories about how they feel about tests. Expressing their feelings in advanced with allow them to know it is safe and acceptable to talk about feelings and express them appropriately.

Parents can help their children prepare for standardized tests by making sure their children are well rested and that they eat breakfast on each test day. Children should also have two sharpened number 2 lead pencils with erasers. Tell your child to fill in the circle for the answer neatly and avoid getting stuck on any one question. It is better to go onto the next question and come back to difficult questions. It is OK to make a best educational guess if your child really is not sure. Remind your child to listen carefully to the teacher before the test begins and take a few deep breaths to relax. A little prayer to Jesus, the Holy Trinity or the Blessed Mother may help your child focus and relax also.

Before the week of the tests, make it clear to your child that one test cannot decide your child's future and that a single test cannot measure all your child's knowledge or skills. A low test score today can't predict what your child will do next year. Remind your child, that your love and acceptance of your child do not depend on test scores.

It is very important that you talk to your child about the test so they understand that the main reason for the test is to follow their learning progress. Not all the questions on the test match what our school system teaches. This is very normal because the tests are based on educational standards across the United States. Almost everyone will be able to answer some questions. Hardly anyone will be able to answer some questions. There may also be questions that no one will get right.

Some children get upset every time someone mentions the word "test". Other children may get upset, feel sick or tired the day of the test or be stressed because of family problems or other reasons. All of these factors will affect a child's concentration and may affect test scores. Therefore one might conclude that a standardized test does not measure how creative or hard-working a child may be or how well a child performs under non-stressful situations.

The test results will point out your child's strengths and weaknesses. Some skills come more naturally to a student, and children can build on these. Parents can use the test results to see what areas need more work. The test results can help the school plan educational programs which will benefit the students. Children can improve test-taking skills by reading, by listening to directions and following directions every day at home and at school. This year we are again using the Stanford. The tests are grade based and should give a clear picture of how your child is achieving in several academic areas compared to other students in his/her grade nationally.
