You can purchase cards before the summer and refill as needed over the summer months. (I have purchased many cards in the lowest denomination possible. No need to spend more money now than I have.)



This is an 'app' for your smart phone. MyScripWallet allows you to buy ScripNow! cards, as well as Reload/ReloadNow your cards from your phone. Some retailers allow you to use your phone as the card – no need to print anything out or have a physical card present. See the Scrip site for directions on setting this up on your phone.



# **Executive Function**







- Collection of related, yet distinct abilities that allow us to direct and regulate our behaviors
- Cliché Errors:
  - ADHD is about distraction...
  - Autism is just about socialization...
  - Anxiety is about worry...
  - Too much technology and not enough parenting...
- Multi-Informant, Multi-Setting, Multi-Method, Performance Testing, and Medical Mimics
- Treatment- medication and psychotherapy produce the best outcomes and satisfaction

# Premise for Supports



- Valuing neuroplasticity
- Wraparound approach
- Multi-modal treatment pathway
- Multiple learning modalities implemented
- Let the fun begin- mantras, schedules of reinforcement, challenges, limit setting, play therapy
- Children learn best from rote rehearsal, repetition, and distributed practice- practice until you puke!

## Response Inhibition: ability to stop and think before acting

- 1. Create conversational rules and guidelines
- 2. Explain the consequences of inappropriate behavior
- 3. Cue child before entering into a situation that will require him to use a skill
- 4. Encourage child to write down any questions or comments instead of interrupting others
- 5. Provide incompatible behavior alternatives
- 6. Train my brain exercise: look at both the word and color BEFORE responding RED- correct / BLUE- wrong







## Working Memory: ability to temporarily hold information in one's head to complete a task

- 1. Train to write down lists, tasks, and messages
- 2. Teach to chunk, repeat, and subvocalize information
- 3. Show how to link and associate information- categories
- 4. Use acronyms, initializations, and silly sentences to remember common usage information
- 5. Paraphrasing after reading text or repeating directions
- Visualize how chores and tasks will be completed and create images of text read

### Auditory Memory- Read information to child Visual Memory- Have child read the Direction aloud

1. When I blow the whistle, quickly line up on this white line. Stop talking and follow me quietly back to class.

#### Your Paraphrase:

2. Walk into the garage, open the car door, and sit in the car. Be sure your seat belt is firmly fastened for safety.

#### Your Paraphrase:

3. Open the dishwasher door, put the dishes and glasses on the racks inside. Silverware goes in the basket. Add detergent. Close the door and start the machine.

#### Your Paraphrase:

4. Put on a helmet. Pick up a bat. Step up to the plate. Watch the ball and swing if the ball is in the strike zone.

Sustained Attention: Ability to maintain attention to the situation or task for a long enough period of time needed to endure the situation or complete the task

- Basis for stamina and endurance in pushing through despite physiological limitations or environmental distractors (fatigue, distractibility, boredom)
- Can only pay attention to one thing efficiently







## Time Management: ability to observe one's own behavior and track progress toward a goal

- 1. Practice estimating time completion for various tasks
- 2. Have child attempt tasks while being timed- beat the clock
- 3. Create a detailed plan or schedule for work or chore completion. Include time frame to complete, materials needed, and location to complete it
- 4. Step by step checklists for daily or irregular tasks
- 5. Highlight the process of self-review
