ATTENTION PARENTS: On Thursday evening, we ran a test of the Wellness Survey that all parents of in-person learners should have received. As with all new systems, there are a few glitches that must be worked out. This survey will be sent out at 5AM each school-day morning beginning on Monday, August 31. It is extremely important that a survey is completed at home for each in-person learning student in order for children to be able to enter the school building. ****Pre-K4 parents,** please remember that you must bring a thermometer to school and to take your child's temperature in front of the staff member in your drop-off line.

Assumption of Risk and Parent Acknowledgement Forms: These two forms were recently added to your School Admin accounts and are now considered past due. They must be signed in the portal in order for your children to attend school in-person.

- Please remember to turn in your pink emergency cards on the first day of school.
- No nuts or items containing nuts may be brought for snack or lunch.
- Class treats (cupcakes, donuts, etc.) may not be brought to school for birthdays.
- Please label all of your child's masks, uniform items, and supplies with their first and last names.
- Please ensure that your child brings lunch and a drink to school every day.
- If your child requires medication during the day, please complete and submit the AOB/MSCS Parents Request to Administer Medication Form, which is attached to this update and found on our website.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures for Pre-K4-8th Grades - 2020-2021

****Please note**, the driveway between the cafeteria and the armory **will be closed** until further notice for both morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up. Due to the need for a new traffic pattern, the only entrance to our parking lot will be at the light on Dorsey Road.**

Morning Drop-off Procedures:

Student arrival times will be staggered in order to help keep students distanced:

7:30-7:45 - Grade 6-8 students (and any younger siblings regardless of grade level)

7:45-7:55 - Grade 3-5 students (and any younger siblings regardless of grade level)

7:55-8:05 - Grade Pre-K4-2 students

Parents are asked to place an 8.5 x 11 paper in the driver's side dashboard window indicating the grade level of the YOUNGEST student in the car as well as students' last names.

When parents arrive in the parking lot, the staff member stationed near the annex will look at the paper in the windshield and hold up a card with a 1, 2 or a 3 on it. That number will correspond to the drop-off lane to which you need to proceed. As in the past, we ask that you pull all the way up to the orange cones at the end of your drop-off lane so that the maximum number of cars can be accommodated at one time.

Pre-K4 parents will be directed to the Temperature Check Lane, which will be the furthest lane on the lot adjacent to the woods and armory. Parents of Pre-K4 children will need to bring a thermometer and take their child's temperature in front of a staff member who will record the data. If the temperature is 100.4 degrees or above, the student may not exit the vehicle.

Staff will be stationed in each drop-off lane to ensure that parents have completed the wellness survey prior to students exiting their cars. If the wellness survey is not completed, the parent will be asked to park along the back fence line in order to fill out the online wellness survey. When finished, the parent will need to then pull back around into the single line entering the lot.

Students must exit their cars on the right side only. They will walk to the nearest adult who will help them cross traffic safely. Parents are not permitted to park their cars and walk children to the building until further notice.

Student cohorts are assigned to enter through one of three doors:

Door #1 - Carport Entrance - Grades Pre-K4, K, and 1

Door #2 - Middle Stairwell (to the right of the carport area) - Grades 3, 7, and 8

Door #3 - Near Annex (between the faculty parking lot and the Edu-Care building) - Grades 2, 4, 5, and 6

Lateness: We are adjusting the times at which students are considered late, as the new drop-off procedures will increase the time it takes to get children into the building each day.

Grade 6-8 students who enter the building after 8:00 a.m. or later are considered late.

Grade 3-5 students who enter the building after 8:15 a.m. or later are considered late.
Grade 1-2 students who enter the building after 8:20 a.m. or later are considered late.
Pre-K4 students who enter the building after 8:30 a.m. are considered late.

**We will review the late times after the first two-weeks of school to determine if we need to make any adjustments to what times students are considered late for school.

Afternoon Pick-up Procedures Pre-K4 Half-Day Students:

Pre-K4 half-day students will be picked up at 11:30 a.m. They will exit through the carport door with their teachers. The teachers will take the students to the square for pick-up. Students will stand on color dots that are socially distant within the square. Parents will need to approach the square, but not step into it, be masked, and at least three feet apart from the next adult. The teacher will release the students from the square to their parents.

Afternoon Pick-up Procedures Pre-K4 Full-Day and Grades K-8 Students:

Please do not come to park for dismissal prior to 1:45 p.m. as PE classes will be held on the parking lot.

As parents arrive, they will be directed by staff members to park in the spots closest to the armory, yet facing the playground. There will be **no** single-child or multiple-child rows as has been customary. Parking procedures will be similar to those experienced when parking at large sporting events or fairs where drivers are directed where to park.

Full-day students will begin their dismissal at 2:43 p.m. in the following manner:

2:43 p.m. - Extended-Care will be dismissed to the cafeteria

2:45 p.m. - Students will be dismissed incrementally by cohorts in the following order:

- Pre-K4, 3rd, and 2nd
- Kindergarten, 7th, and 4th
- 1st, 8th, and 5th
- 6th

Parents need to take their children to their cars as soon as possible. Parents and students may not congregate in small groups before moving to cars.

At 2:45, traffic will be stopped at the stop sign near the annex for any late arriving cars. Parents are strongly encouraged to arrive for dismissal prior to 2:45 p.m.

Pre-K, K, and 1st grade children will be taken to the square for pick-up. Students will stand on color dots that are socially distant within the square. Parents will need to approach the square, but not step into it, be masked, and at least three feet apart from the next adult. The teacher will release the students from the square to their parents.

Parents of new students and younger children, until these students are comfortable walking themselves to their vehicles, may wait in the area adjacent to the square, but must be masked and at least three feet apart from the next adult.

All other parents are encouraged to remain at their vehicles and have their students meet them there. As always, no pets are allowed to be out of vehicles.

Dismissal will begin from the rows closest to the armory once the late pick-up students have been identified. Anticipate that this process will take longer than a typical dismissal; therefore, **please do not schedule any appointments immediately after school.**

Late pick-up families will be directed to park in the row closest to the playground when it is deemed safe to do so. Students being picked up late will remain in the auditorium until it is safe to walk them outside and over to their cars.

**We will review the dismissal procedure after the first two-weeks of school to determine if we need to make any adjustments to the process.

We thank you in advance for your cooperation and patience as we implement these new procedures.
