Important News & Notes:

Family Income Survey: Each year, the Maryland State Department of Education tasks the Archdiocese of Baltimore schools with collecting family income data. Historically, families have received a paper form that is filled out and returned to school. This year, the information will be collected through a secure Google form: https://docs.google.com/forms/d/

e/1FAIpQLSfgzg7It0zs4nQXaAiWsZf9fMw0wOlm8d4ISVkHZrW0CQ2_yQ/viewform . The information gathered through this survey is completely confidential and will assist Monsignor Slade Catholic School in receiving state textbook funding and grants. Families are asked to **complete one survey per student** enrolled in Pre-K-8th grades at Monsignor Slade. The survey takes approximately 2-4 minutes to do and they must be completed by October 15, 2020. We appreciate your prompt attention to this very important matter.

Scantron Performance Series: Attached to this update is important information regarding the Scantron Performance Series which is replacing the IOWA Assessment, as well as the tentative testing schedule. Please read this information carefully as incremental testing will begin next week for our students. Students in grades 2-5 will need to have headphones or wired earbuds for use during their test as there is audio assistance on parts of the math assessment. Remote learners will be taking the Scantron at the same time as in-person learners. Login information will be sent home to each remote student in grades 2-8.

Safety Reminders: Parents, please be sure to wear masks as you are dropping off and picking up your children each day. Also, please ensure that the Wellness Survey has been completed for all in-person learners each day. Beginning on Monday, in order to help speed up the process of morning dropoff, other than the Pre-K4 line which requires a temperature check, temperature checks will not be performed in the first three drop-off lanes. If parents have not completed the Wellness Survey or do not have the email confirmation that the survey has been completed, parents will be asked to park along the back fence, complete the survey, and then circle back into the arrival line. Thank you for your cooperation as we are continually trying to streamline our procedures.

Remote Learner Attendance Information:

- Remote learning students must be sitting at their computer ready to start the day. If a remote learner joins only for homeroom and fails to attend the synchronous classes for the day, then that student will be marked absent.
- In-person students who need to quarantine for a positive COVID test, potential exposure, or some other situation that is COVID related are granted remotestudent status on a temporary basis (10-14 days). If these students join synchronous classes, they will be considered present for attendance purposes. If they do not join synchronous classes, they will be coded absent.

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Important News & Notes (continued):

Tardy Students:

- Grade 6-8 students who enter the building after 7:55 a.m. or later are considered late.
- Grade 3-5 students who enter the building after 8:05 a.m. or later are considered late.
- Grade K-2 students who enter the building after 8:15 a.m. or later are considered late.
- Pre-K4 students who enter the building after 8:20 a.m. are considered late.
- Doors #2 and #3 will be closed at 7:55 a.m. when the morning bell sounds. All students arriving after 7:55 a.m. will enter through the carport door.
- Students who arrive after their designated tardy time will be issued a late slip by Mrs. Lenzenweger as they enter the building.

Ill Students and Remote Learning:

- Regardless of Learning Mode, students who are ill are welcomed to attend remotely as long as they feel well enough to do so; however, this is not a requirement since they should be using their time at home to recover.
- In-person students who are out of school due to illness and who do not join synchronous classes will be marked absent.
- Remote learners who are not sitting at their computers for homeroom will be marked absent. If they join their synchronous classes, the attendance code will be changed to present.
- Regardless of Learning Mode, students who are marked as absent will be given the same number of days as absent to make up work.

Vacationing Students and Remote Learning:

- Absences during the year due to family vacations is strongly discouraged. Work will not be provided ahead of time for students going on vacation.
- Regardless of Learning Mode, students who are vacationing are welcomed to attend remotely; however, this is not a requirement.
- Regardless of Learning Mode, students who are on vacation and who choose to join synchronous classes will be expected to turn in all classwork and homework assignments on time. There is no extension of time on assignments.
- In-person students who are out of school due to a vacation and who do not join synchronous classes will be marked absent.
- Remote learners who are not sitting at their computers for homeroom will be marked absent. If they join their synchronous classes, the attendance code will be changed to present.

Tuition Assistance Out-of-Uniform Day: Next Friday, September 25, for a \$2 donation to the Tuition Assistance Fund, students may dress out-of-uniform for the day. Students may also select to wear a mask that has a design printed on it or one of another color; however, all masks still need to be cloth. The masks must be free of any slogans and phrases, political or social messaging, controversial material or any material not aligned to our mission as a Catholic school. All out-of-uniform rules apply. Please see the Parent & Student Handbook, pp. 46-47, for more information.

School Store purchases: Since the school store is currently unavailable in the morning, if your child should need some type of school supply item, you may send in an order for the item(s) by using the Bookstore Price List attached to this update. Please list your child's name, homeroom, and the item needed on the front of an envelope and enclose payment in the envelope. Please include the exact amount in cash or by check as, unfortunately, no change can be given. Upon arriving at school, the student should give the envelope to his/her homeroom teacher, and she will send it down to the bookstore. Depending on when the order is received, the requested item will usually be sent to the child's classroom by the end of the day. If virtual learners need to replenish school supplies, such as copy books, or other required items, please email Mrs. Sullivan (k.sullivan@msladeschool.com) to make arrangements to pick up the items at the front desk.

Grade Level Reminders:

Grades 2-8: Beginning next week, we will be administering the Scantron Performance Series to students. This assessment replaces the IOWA Assessment that was given in previous years. Please see all of the attachments at the end of this update.

Grades 4-8: Today Mr. Osment presented a virtual band demonstration for grades 4-8. The demonstration is available on the Instrumental Music Program website at www.instrumentalmusicprogram.org. If your child is interested in joining Slade's virtual school band, please fill out the registration form from the Instrumental Music Program which is attached to this update and mail it to the address on the form. The second band attachment contains information from Music and Arts about renting an instrument. While parents do not have to rent from Music and Arts, they do provide Monsignor Slade families a great deal on rental pricing.



Grades 6-8: Virtual High School Fairs: On September 28, October 6, and October 19, Catholic High Schools in the Archdiocese of Baltimore will host a Virtual High School Fair for all prospective families. From 5:00pm to 7:00pm, families will have the opportunity to engage with representatives from Catholic high schools throughout the diocese. The sessions will provide a glimpse into the admissions process, highlight signature programs, and share information regarding scholarships, financial aid, transportation, and much more! 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Grade Level Reminders:

Grade 8: The HSPT Registration Portal is now open. Click on the link to register your students for the December 2, 2020, test which will be held here at MSCS. The cost of the test is \$40 and must be paid online when you register. Be sure to select Monsignor Slade (005) as the site where your child will test. https://stsusers.com/stsusers/registration/static/baltimore.php.



From the Health Room:

- When answering "yes" to any wellness survey question, please include a contact number so the nurse can call if she has any questions.
- Please be accurate in the reporting of your child's health when answering the daily wellness survey. Honest and accurate responses will allow us to remain open and keep our children safe.
- Although many individuals with presumptive COVID-19 cases are utilizing the rapid test (POC) to get immediate feedback on their condition, the Maryland Department of Health does not consider the rapid test (POC) accurate for the purposes of public health evaluation. Therefore, a negative PCR test is required to be able to return to school. (Updated 9/18/2020 from the Maryland State and County Health Departments.)
- After an illness related absence, the child MUST report directly to the nurse's office with a written alternative diagnosis or negative test result before going to class. Doctor's notes and negative PCR test results can also be faxed to the school nurse.
- If a student is absent for an illness or COVID-like symptoms... please email absences@msladeschool.com with the following information:
 - ♦ Name of student.
 - ♦ Homeroom/Grade.
 - ♦ Symptoms and what day they started.
 - ♦ Action plan-will you be going to the doctor OR getting a COVID test OR isolating 10 days.
 - OR call the school between the hours of 7:15AM and 3:15PM and ask to speak to the nurse. The nurse will then give the parent(s) instructions for the student to be able to return to school.
- Close contacts are defined as people within 6 ft with or without a mask for 15 minutes or longer.
- If a parent or immediate family member is sick... please keep your child (close contact) home from school to decrease the risk of transmission. Children may return to school once the sick individual receives a negative COVID-19 PCR test or an alternative diagnosis from a physician.
- If a parent or immediate family member receives a positive test... please try to isolate yourself as much as possible and follow the Maryland Health Department Guidelines. Children must quarantine for 14 days since the last exposure to the COVID-19 positive parent before returning to school.



At least 24 hours no fever without taking medication

Symptoms have improved.

OR


Doctor's note with a <u>written alternative</u> <u>diagnosis</u> and symptoms have improved/no fever for 24 hours without medication.

A Parent's Guide to Performance Series

- The Archdiocese of Baltimore's Department of Catholic Schools is using Performance Series by Scantron this year as our diagnostic and placement tool for Grades 2–8.
- The Performance Series assessments make it easy for your child's teachers to identify areas of strength and areas for growth. The new suite of assessments will provide teachers with detailed information that will inform their daily instruction. Overall, teachers will use the data from these assessments to:
 - · identify your child's ability levels.
 - · demonstrate academic growth over time.
 - place your child in the appropriate instructional group.
 - identify gaps in knowledge and skill acquisition.



Dear Parents / Guardians,

The information found on the subsequent pages will introduce you to the new standardized testing program for the Archdiocese of Baltimore. During the 2020-21 academic year, all students in grades 2-8 will complete a reading, language, and mathematics assessment in the fall, winter, and spring. In the spring, students in grades 3, 5, and 7 will complete science and social studies assessments. These assessments are shorter than the lowa and CogAT, so the total amount of time testing will be comparable to previous years. Since testing in the spring of 2020 was canceled due to school closure, it is essential that we assess students this fall to determine potential content knowledge and skill gaps.

Further communication about the test will take place gradually throughout the year. Expect details on testing dates and results to come from your child's teacher and/or principal.

This decision was made by a team of leaders in the Department of Catholic Schools and principals across the Archdiocese. All schools were consulted on the decision and we are all excited about the value that the new platform will provide.

What is Performance Series®?


Performance Series is an online computer-adaptive test that adjusts to your child's instructional levels based on his or her responses to questions. Unlike other assessments, Performance Series is norm-referenced and completely computer-based, and all test results are available to teachers and administrators immediately.

All tests begin in relation to your child's current grade level the first time he or she takes a test in that subject. For those students who tested previously, the next test taken starts at a difficulty level where the student left off at the end of the last test. All scores are used for instructional grouping and to show growth and progress over time toward academic goals.

Computer-adaptive testing works by presenting questions that adjust based on the student's answers. Questions get slightly easier when a student answers incorrectly and slightly more challenging when a student answers correctly. Due to the adaptive nature of the test, each student will have a unique testing experience that will more accurately measure your child's instructional level.

Why is this helpful to me?

- Unique tests matched to your child's instructional level more accurately determine his or her next steps in the classroom.
- Results from these tests provide information to help you understand your child's growth academically, through this year and across years.



Why is this helpful to my child's teacher?

- Immediate results mean teachers can adjust instruction more quickly to help your child master important concepts.
- Educational materials can be customized by group or individual student based on score results, which helps teachers improve learning outcomes.
- Detailed reports allow teachers to evaluate current or new teaching strategies against the scores for the class and make adjustments as needed for any skills and/or concepts that may need re-teaching.

When are the tests given?


The tests are administered three (3) times per year in reading, mathematics, and language arts for grades 2-8. As a result of the computer-based model, students will spend less total time testing then previously seen with paper and pencil tests that took up to a week of instructional time.



What Do the Scores Mean to Me and My Child?

Scaled Score

The Performance Series tests use a scaled score as an estimate of your child's instructional level, which is independent of grade level. The scaled score spans across all grade levels and all tests, so teachers and parents are able to monitor growth and progress in a subject over time. If you think of the scaled score as an "educational yardstick" you can then measure your child's growth from fall to spring in one school year or from year to year. Along with a scaled score per test, there are other ways to measure a student's growth and progress as well as how your child's score compares to others in his or her grade level. You can see a sample of the scores in the Parent Summary Report below.



Gains

Gains refer to the number of scaled score points between one test and another in the same subject. Gains are shown in the trend line on the student profile. Teachers and parents can look at a full year of growth for a child and see if that child "grew" at the same pace as other students who tested similarly in the fall in Scantron's national norm group.

National Percentile Ranking (NPR)

The National Percentile Ranking score (NPR) compares your child's scaled score to the scores of his or her grade level peers in Scantron's national norm group. For example, if your child has an NPR of 74, your child's score is above 74% of his or her peers in the same grade level in the national norm group.

Performance Rating

The performance rating represents your child's rating in the context of the Scantron-defined set of performance bands by scaled score range. There are four (4) bands in the set, each one representing an NPR quartile.

What Else Should I Know?

Suggested Learning Objectives (SLOs)

The Scantron skills that are measured in the Performance Series tests are aligned to the custom standards selected by the diocese. These skills appear on reports as Suggested Learning Objectives by unit for your child and are individualized based on your child's test experience. The scaled score works in tandem with the diocesan standards to determine where to focus your child's learning.

Are the tests timed?

No, children are allowed as much time as needed to take the test.

Do all students see the same test?

All children see the same topic areas, but all children do not see the same test questions, because Performance Series is computer-adaptive—each test is unique for each child.

How many test items does each student receive?

The test is online and computer-adaptive, so each child receives a unique test and the number of items may vary. There is no set number of questions. The average number of questions in a testing session is about 50.

JOIN THE SCHOOL BAND

OBJECTIVE

The purpose of the program is to broaden the education of the child by giving him/her an understanding of music. Participation in the band gives the student a feeling of accomplishment which is becoming such a rare but valuable part of life. The mental and physical disciplines involved in learning to read and play music are of immeasurable value to the overall development of the child. Our purpose is to bring the experience of music to every child.

FORMAT

Classes are organized to offer instruction on band instruments to all interested students enrolled in the 4th through 8th grade. These classes are taught by highly qualified teachers. Classes meet once a week from October through May, except on school holidays (minimum of 28 lessons). Due to the limitation imposed by Covid-19, we have made changes to our format for this year. We are prepared to teach in-person or virtual lessons and how we proceed will be at the discretion of each school. The health and safety of our students and staff is paramount. All guidelines of the archdiocese and each school will be followed. Ideally students will be scheduled by instrument or level of achievement, but this year's groupings may be by cohort. Again, this will be determined by the individual schools. Our virtual lessons will take place after school hours and will be offered at different times throughout the week to accommodate the needs of our families. First year students do not become members of the school band until they reach a prescribed level of achievement. Second year students, with few exceptions, are full-fledged members of the school band. All band rehearsals will take place via Zoom. Instruction is offered on flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, baritone horn, bass guitar and snare drum.

THITION

There is a **non-refundable** registration fee of \$25.00 **for one child** or \$50.00 **per family**. This is an annual fee and **MUST ACCOMPANY THE REGISTRATION FORM.** There is no increase in tuition this year. The **yearly** tuition for lessons is payable in two plans: monthly or by the semester.

MONTHLY PLAN
(9 installments through June)
One child - \$93.00 per installment
Family - \$142.00 per installment

SEMESTER PLAN
(2 installments, due October 15th and February 1st)
One child - \$410.00
Family - \$622.00

To ensure your child's name is included on the schedule, please mail the registration form and fee to our office as soon as possible. Those who choose the monthly plan should include the first month's payment; a payment coupon book will be mailed when the payment is received. If you choose the semester plan, you must register now but have the option of deferring the tuition payment until a little later; all semester payments must be received by October 15th to qualify for the discounted rate. **DO NOT RETURN THIS FORM AND PAYMENT TO SCHOOL**; please mail the form and all payments to our address. If you prefer to pay by credit card or set up recurring payments, please call the music program office at 410-442-5804. A small transaction fee will be assessed for all credit card payments. You may also set up auto-payments through your bank's website, and your bank will mail the check to us.

PLEASE NOTE: It is necessary for the children to participate for AT LEAST ONE YEAR if they are to develop to the point where they can see the value of continuing their music studies. Because the teachers' schedules are set according to the number of students at the beginning of the year, **WITHDRAWAL WILL NOT BE PERMITTED UNTIL THE END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR** except for extraordinary circumstances such as moving, prolonged illness, the written request of the classroom teacher, or on the advice of the music instructor. The lesson schedule will be announced in the latter part of September.

INSTRUMENT RENTAL: In order to provide instruments at the lowest rental cost, the program has contacted Music and Arts. Information pertaining to their rental program was sent home with your child. 


- · Find a quiet place to record.

- Record final version


