

Breakfast 101

We hear it all the time, from our parents, from the news, and now from the School Nurse:

Breakfast is the most important meal of the day!!

Life can be hectic, school opens at 7:30, and children don't always want to eat in the morning. All of these things can prevent children from eating an 'ideal' breakfast. Luckily, breakfast doesn't have to be gourmet.

A good breakfast should include complex carbohydrates (with whole grains), protein, and fiber. The carbohydrates provide immediate energy, the protein provides energy for later, and the fiber helps maintain the feeling of fullness.

Some ideas for breakfast from kidhealth.org are:

- Whole-grain cereal topped with fruit and a cup of yogurt
- Whole-grain waffles topped with peanut/soy nut butter, fruit, or ricotta cheese
- Whole-wheat pita stuffed with sliced hard-cooked eggs
- Hot cereal topped with cinnamon, nutmeg, allspice, or cloves
- Vegetable omelet with whole-wheat toast and orange juice
- Hummus on a whole-wheat pita and milk
- Lean turkey on a toasted English muffin and vegetable juice
- Heated leftover rice with chopped apples, nuts, and cinnamon, plus fruit juice
- Low-fat cream cheese and fresh fruit, such as sliced strawberries, on whole-grain bread or a whole-grain bagel
- Shredded cheese on a whole-wheat tortilla, folded in half, microwaved for 20 seconds and topped with salsa

It is important to read the nutrition labels when buying breakfast items. For example, toaster pastries are quick and easy, but many brands have the equivalent nutritional value of a candy bar. Foods high in simple sugars without other forms of energy (proteins and complex carbohydrates) can cause kid's blood sugar to spike and then crash mid-morning, causing headaches and stomachaches

To help the morning rush go smoothly try the following suggestions from kidshealth.org:

- Stock your kitchen with healthy breakfast options
- Prepare as much as you can the night before (gets dishes and utensils ready, cut up fruit, etc.)
- Get everyone up 10 minutes earlier
- Let kids help plan and prepare breakfast
- Have grab-and-go alternatives (fresh fruit, individual boxes of cereal, yogurt or smoothies, trail-mix) on days when there is little or no time to eat

Children who eat breakfast tend to perform better in school, are less tired and restless, and have a lower risk of obesity. Parents who eat breakfast have similar results. Often in the health room, children and teens come in the mid-morning, tired and with stomach aches, because they have not eaten breakfast or have only eaten items high in simple sugars for breakfast and snack.
